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Cultural Practices and Artistic Expressions of the Major Tribes of Uttarakhand: A Sociocultural Study

A tribe is a community of people observing similar customs and traditions or an aggregate of people who share a common religion, history, language, or culture. Each tribe is unique in the expression of its own culture and practices. Nadeem Hasnain has given certain characteristics of a tribe. According to him, "Kinship ties, common territory, one language, joint ownership, one political organization, absence of internecine strife has all been referred to as the main characteristics of a tribe" (273). Though there are contested views regarding the status and existence of the tribes in the colonial period. the tribe in the Indian perspective is conceived as the creation of internal politics, and it is not an outcome of colonial governance. It is a category that is not incorporated into mainstream India. According to Subhadra Mitra Channa, "In the post-colonial period, the term 'tribe' was either replaced or supplemented with the concepts of ethnic group and indigenous people, both of which are also contested and come with their own agendas and contexts."
